



donning "pink" during this festive day. The theme of Laetare Sunday is derived from the entrance antiphon, which draws inspiration from Isaiah 66:10-11. The antiphon proclaims, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast." The word "Laetare," which translates to "rejoice," is the first word in the Latin text. On *Laetare* Sunday, just like the Third Sunday of Advent's *Gaudete* Sunday, the Church expresses hope and joy amidst the solemnity of Lenten fasts and penances. This change in color, symbolized by the use of pink or rose, represents a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we embark on the somber days of Passiontide. The anticipation of Easter is further emphasized by several other intriguing liturgical possibilities. During Lent, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal prohibits the use of flowers on the altar. However, on *Laetare* Sunday, as well as solemnities and feasts within the Lenten season, there's a temporary relaxation of these penitential observances. I vividly recall the occasion when I was a parish liturgy director, decorating the altar with pink roses on that special day. Notably, marriages were generally prohibited during Lent. However, Laetare Sunday, often celebrated on the day before Ash Wednesday, was traditionally associated with a day when marriages could be performed during the penitential season. While marriages are now only permitted on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, *Laetare* Sunday remains an ideal day for couples seeking to tie the knot before Eastertide. Laetare Sunday serves as the Church's way of providing us with a "boost" as we approach the darkness and horror of the days leading up to Good Friday and Holy Saturday. It presents an opportunity to relish and remember the promise that awaits us on Easter Sunday—the reality that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. and that our hearts will always be filled with joy! By recognizing and embracing traditions and customs, we can fully appreciate the beauty of our faith. As you can see, even a seemingly ordinary day like the Fourth Sunday of Lent holds significant meaning and is associated with various aspects of our Catholic tradition, extending beyond this day and encompassing the entire Lenten season, the 50 days of Easter, and beyond. Take advantage of the richness and depth of our Catholic heritage.

Stations of the Cross:

an Rules of Fasting and Abstinence (from USCCB): Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of For members of the Latin Catholic abstinence. Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
